- c. Looked at the website 2 days prior to going to Axtell. I found the web site easy to go through with no difficulty. The information about Axtell Cash Program, Axtell Doughboy, Paul Grove Park and the Axtell Community Calendar were very informative.

1. The “Five-Minute” Impression: After taking a five-minute drive through the community without stopping, the following reactions were noted. The following observations were noted when entering the community from major entrances (signs, streetscapes, buildings, etc.)

- a. Very nice sports field, beautiful modern playground. Well maintained community. There was a nice large sign at Highway 36 and 110 intersection. Home of Eagles. West/South entrance very nice.
- b. Playground very attractive, paved roads are well kept and clean. Lack of signage for major buildings- city hall, community building, Axtell schools.
- c. The houses and yards of the community were very neat and clean. Lawns were mowed. Downtown was receiving some oil and chat on one street. I did not see a “Lot of junk” in the yards or behind houses. The 5-minute impression of the community was very good. Could not find any signs showing where the high school was located or the city hall. Of course, it didn’t take long to find them.

2. Downtown Business Area

Describe the customer service received when you entered those retail businesses. (Were you greeted? Did you have to ask for assistance?)

- a. Very nice, well-kept buildings downtown. Signs were good. Aces Restaurant/Bar. Food and drinks. Customer service was great as was the food.
- b. The buildings seemed to be well kept from outside and signage was okay. Aces Bar/Restaurant. We had lunch here and there was good food and customer service was excellent!
- c. The downtown business area looked neat and clean. Different businesses had their sign on their store. We ate lunch at the Bar and Grill. The food was excellent, and the manager was very friendly. We did not go into any other business except City Hall. The city clerk was not aware of the program "First Impressions" but she was very receptive and provided lots of information about the community and various organizations. Her people skills were excellent! There was no sign "City Hall" but we figured it out.

What public amenities were available (drinking fountains, benches, public restrooms, etc.) Comment on appealing landscaping and streetscaping. Did you have difficulty finding parking? Could you access multiple services from where you parked?

- a. Benches, restrooms, and picnic areas. There was plenty of parking downtown at the time we were there. It seemed like most businesses were within walking distance roughly 1-2 blocks.
- b. Benches and public restrooms at City Park. Parking was great, and all businesses were accessible from 1 block area.
- c. We parked on main street in front of the bar/grill. The sidewalks were clean and easily marked for the steps.

- a. Saw one building that might have had 8-10 units. City Clerk said they were small 1 bedroom.

- c. The houses all looked clean and neat for a person to rent or buy.

7. Schools

Do the following schools appear to be adequate in size or do you see the use of temporary classrooms? Are the buildings and grounds well-maintained?

- a. Pre-K through 12. Very well maintained and doing inside remodeling to move office closer to front of building for better safety for the children and staff.
- b. Very well maintained. Pre-K through 12. One concern- safety of bleachers at city park field.
- c. We visited the high school. We went in the high school and visited with the principal. The building part we saw was relatively old like a lot of small towns. The school (what we saw) looked neat and clean. The school secretary was not aware of the "First Impressions Program." She was very friendly and courteous to us. The principal and secretary talked about the possibility of renovating the building and moving the principal's office near the front entrance for safety reasons and to get more space.

- a. No, I couldn't find it. Some information but nothing on test scores.

- c. The church buildings all appeared to be clean and mowed. They were attractive buildings. We saw the Catholic church, Methodist church and the Lutheran church.

- c. We saw the doughboy monument. It was well preserved. We did not observe any evidence of civic organization activity.

- a. Sidewalks and streets were all maintained well, and streets were well marked. Homes and landscape were beautiful, very well kept.

- c. We went to the south end of town and examined the football field and playground area. It was a very nice, attractive and safe playground. The bleachers on the football field looked old and dangerous.

- a. Lack of employment within community.
- b. Lack of employment in the community- many people travel to other towns for work.
- c. I am not sure, but I know that in a lot of small communities/towns, it is difficult to maintain a good population for people to live there so that we can still maintain a good school system and community pride.

What will you remember most about this community six month from now (positive or negative)?

- a. How pretty it was. Homes and landscaping very well maintained. Residents seemed to take pride in their community- it showed.
- b. Very nice farming community and roads well kept.
- c. I liked the rolling hills and large cornfields. I will remember that it appears that people in this community take pride in their small community- with attractive houses and yards and various support groups that help maintain a quality of life in Axtell, Kansas.
