- Several First National Bank signs












Downtown Business Area

Health Care Services

Health care services readily available in Phillipsburg (22 miles), Alma(17 miles) or Norton (22 miles). It was reported that most elders move to Alma or Norton to be closer to health care services as they age.





Housing

- Total Number of Housing Units 81
- Median house value in \$43,644
- Occupied 67
- Vacant 14
- Home owned 55.2%
- Homes rented 44.8%
- Approximately 50% of houses were built before 1939

- Few houses for sale
- Has more rentals than most NW Kansas Communities

- Mixture of sidewalk conditions








- City Hall is located in the same building as the volunteer fire and EMS

Recreation/Tourism

- Recreation and tourism events or activities were not evident
- The historic marker has potential if the area was cleaned up and made more inviting. As it is, it's hidden and difficult to find.
