- 68.8% family households, 31.2% non-family
- Poverty rate is 11.6% (KS=13.6%)
- Median Age 31.9 years (36)



Housing

- There are 602 housing units
- 506 are occupied (96.0%) (KS= 89.5%)
- 96 are vacant (4.0%) (KS= 10.5%)
- Owner Occupied: 271 (54%) (KS=66.7%)
- Renter Occupied: 235 (46%) (KS= 33.3%)







Housing

- Quite a mixture of housing, often side by side.
- All three visitors commented on the mix of trailers interspersed with homes.

- A list was available at City Office

Schools

- Preschool through sixth grade
- Middle School and High School at Prairie View
 - 5 miles west on Highway 152
- Our survey asks about the presence of print materials about the school, but most people who are looking for information about schools will look online.









Childcare

- 4 Child care providers were listed online.
- Your team told us that there is in-home care and at the school district.





Faith/Religion

 Churches are listed on City website under "New Here?"















Church activities

- "Celebrate Recovery" was seen on the Christian Church.
- A brochure in the City offices spoke of a Spaghetti Supper.
- Food Pantry at United Methodist Church.









Civic

- A Volunteer Chamber of Commerce.
- Visitors didn't see any evidence of other civic groups.
- Senior Center was observed.
- 4-H, Boy Scouts & Girl Scouts here.
- Library Board.








Public Infrastructure

- Sidewalk along Hwy 152 was a fantastic way to be welcomed to town.
- Construction of the new water system was prominent everywhere.

This sidewalk was noted along Hwy 152 just west

of this building.

- City hall and Police Station downtown
- Receptionist was friendly, open and helpful—gave a list of landlords, civic activities were in plain sight with brochures for nearby attractions.

Significant Events and Drawing people to town

- SwanFest.
- Jealous of proximity to Kansas City and Paola— the opportunity to promote day-trippers or agritourism events.
- Presence of Marais de Cygne River and lake for camping, hunting and fishing. Are Float Trips done?
- Opportunity to capitalize on the beautiful location and outdoor recreation.





Most Positive Observations

- Proximity to urban areas is a big plus.
- Grocery store (rare in this size town!)
- New Library.
- Park/Walking trail.
- Medical Clinic.
- Loved the Veterans Memorial on main street.









Biggest Obstacles/Challenges

- Lack of sidewalks connecting the entire town.
- Housing.
- Older signage can make town seem dated.
- High percentage of rental housing.
