What is the Farm Bill?

About every five years, Congress develops a massive piece of legislation known as the **"farm bill"** which sets the 'rules of the road' for our nation's food and farm system.

The farm bill contains policies, programs, and funding – everything from rules around who is eligible for a farm loan to funding for food assistance for low-income families.

What's it Mean to be "IN" the Farm Bill?



HOW DOES FARM BILL SPENDING BREAK DOWN?



Farm Bill Priorities: Just a Few of Many

- Tackle the climate crisis, including through expanded working lands conservation programs and accelerating the adoption of practices that reduce emissions and build resilience to changing weather patterns.
- Invest increased funding in and expand support for key local and regional food systems programs & infrastructure for example, food hubs, farmers markets, livestock processing, marketing, food safety needs, and more.
- Advance stronger racial equity priorities across all USDA programs, including access to credit and land, for producers too long left out, especially farmers of color.
- □ Address needed structural reforms around crop insurance, commodity subsidies, and more to ensure fair competition and reduce consolidation.



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
