


Nutrition Incentive Hub Rural Convening Highlights June 20-23

- Nutrition Incentive Hub = National TA Center for SNAP Incentive and Produce Prescription projects funded by the USDA GusNIP grant

- Tour of Double Up Food Bucks Heartland's work with rural grocery stores in Kansas
