

About This Role:

This full-time, eight-week fellowship will run from June 3 through July 26, 2024 **OR** part-time, 12 week fellowship will run from mid May through early August.

Responsibilities:

	 Implement one or more KSDE School Nutrition Programs that increase food security and healthy food consumption of students (examples: second chance breakfast, grab-and-go breakfast, fruit and vegetable program, etc.) Implement sustainable strategies within the USD110 School Nutrition Program to: Increase the procurement of locally produced foods and increase amount of food procured through local grocer(s) Increase donations of locally produced foods Participate in marketing of donation drives for local foods to be utilized for the School Nutrition Program and/or school based food pantry. Collaborate with K-State Research and Extension and SNAP-Ed to establish additional priority goals of the food fellow project. Align Food Fellow projects with School Wellness Committee initiatives. Complete final report to be submitted to K-State Research and Extension Local Food Systems Program Coordinator before finishing fellowship time period.
